

29th March 2020, 5th Sunday of Lent Service by Pip Lawrence

As we are currently church in a different way, we begin by recalling verses from 1Peter:2 4-5. "As you come to him, the living stone - rejected by men, but chosen by God and precious to him -you also, like living stones, are being built up into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ".

Today we are living stones in the body of Christ physically based in our homes but spiritually we are one in heart and mind as we remember this is the day when we would normally gather to worship together. Today we remind ourselves, as we join in this act of worship, that The Lord is with us all.

Jesus answers questions, he quells fear, he overlooks faithlessness, and the outcome is completely and utterly astonishing. All of us today have our own situations to deal with.

There will be questions, loss, illness, faithlessness and a myriad of other issues. Jesus will enter into all of our situations if we ask him. He will help us, hold us and carry us. In this time of change and facing the unknown we can trust him. I know it is a long chapter, but we have time at the moment. So maybe read the chapter again and be blessed.

May God's blessing surround us each day, as we trust him and walk in his way. May his presence within guard and keep us from sin. Go in peace, go in joy, go in love. Amen.
